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President's Items

Board of Director's

Due changes from the AGM elections for Board of Directors and email vote for Vice-President; Cris, Darren, Jessica and Sam met with Oluwafemi Oluyemi at the TD Bank on December 6, 2018 to update the signing authorities at the Bank.

Hall Insurance

KCA received an email from Commercial Insurance at Tool Peet dated November 27, 2018 **Subject: 2018 Insurance Renewal Status Up-date** As previously communicated, when changing insurance companies, it did give us the opportunity to strengthen your policy in certain areas. As of Dec 1st, your coverage will change as follows:

- Voluntary payments for volunteers will now be included
- Full abuse liability coverage will be included (we will be contacting you to assist with completing the <u>required application</u> for this coverage)
- There will no longer be an aggregate on your liability coverage
- Your Commercial General Liability coverage will no longer be subject to a deductible for bodily injury type claims
- Property coverage will now be subject to a \$2,500 deductible

KCA received email dated Dec 14, 2018 from Toole Peet Insurance for Hall Insurance with Invoice 267183 - \$3,954.00, which was paid December 18, 2018. This was an increase from \$3001.00.

The "Abuse Prevention Protocol" which was offered by Toole Peet Insurance was signed effective January 1, 2019. The carrier is "Northbridge Insurance". The policy establishes how "The Organization" will prevent physical, emotional and sexual abuse of children, youth, seniors and other vulnerable adults by its employees and volunteers. The Organization" seeks to create a welcoming and nurturing environment and has zero tolerance for those actions may jeopardize the safety, health or innocence of those in the organization's care.

Cris emailed the Abuse Prevention Protocol Policy to board members to read the information to familiarize themselves with the protocol. Replies were received from all Board Members to acknowledging that they had read the policy. Thank-you board members.

Cris received an email dated January 9, 2018 from Michael Murray at Toole Peet - with additional information:

"Your liability policy (including abuse liability) covers your organization for the actions of your employees and volunteers. And covers any negligence your organization may be responsible for in terms of the actions taking by your contractors. Your contractors should be carrying their own insurance, if they do not then your organization will likely be responsible for most of the damages should your hired contractors cause any.

Should children (or seniors) be left in the care, custody and control of your organization, then yes the Volunteers and Employees that work with these children (or seniors) require a vulnerable sector check to be done.

RE: KCA Events – typical community 'events' require children (or seniors) to be under the supervision of their parents/guardians – if this is the case with your organization then these event volunteers do not require a vulnerable sector check."

Dyson Vacuum Purchase

Jen phoned Cris to ask if she can purchase a Dyson vacuum which would assist with the small cleanups to save some time in cleaning the hall. The cleaners now have to haul the huge vacuum upstairs which is time consuming and somewhat strenuous. Cris discussed the purchase with of Dyson vacuum with Darren, he was OK with purchasing the vacuum cleaner.

The Office Manager purchased the Dyson vacuum cleaner which was on sale reduced by \$100.00 for \$299.99+ GST \$15.00 for a total of \$314.99. The vacuum can be returned. I ask the board to consider keeping the vacuum to assist cleaners.

Motion: I, Chris Kemp-Jackson make a motion to keep the Dyson vacuum that was purchased to \$314.99 to assist cleaners with same clean-up jobs. Second: Donna. All in Favour.

<u>Community Cleanups - 2019 Application Information</u>

Ann received an email from Jennifer Lawlor date December 11, 2018 which was sent on behalf YYC with the following message.

"On behalf of The City of Calgary, Community Standards and Waste & Recycling Services, we would like to say thank you for another amazing year of Community Cleanups in 2018. We collected a total of 1.3 million kg in total with 1.2 million kg of waste and over 125,000 kg of organics! Your community leadership is appreciated for making this such a successful program."

Please note the registration process has changed from a first-come first-serve format to an application period format.

The application for "Clean-up Day" must be submitted by January 7, 2019 which is before our next official meeting. An email vote was conducted by the Board of Directors. Cris consulted with the Board of Directors for date preferences; the following dates were submitted to Ann to forward to the city:

Choice 1 - Jun 8; Choice 2 - Jun 22; Choice 3 - Jun 15

KCA will be notified of the status of your application by mid-February 2019.

Cris received email dated December 31, 2018 from Ann; "which stated that Dick and I had a meeting last week and have decided that he will look after most of the Clean-up Day including applying to the City. I will be on call for questions and will look after the food on the day and be down at the hall for the actual clean up".

Dick will let us know what date we get and will also get in touch with Jen for the newsletter information.

Thank-you Dick; for your support for this important annual event which is held each year and is well attended.

<u>Planning Update - Change to Public Notices - Facebook posted</u>

As per FCC Get Activated email dated December 12, 2018 FFC information - As of early 2019, Public notices will no longer be posted in The Calgary Herald. Moving forward, public notices will include the physical notice board on site, mail circulation to adjacent neighbours, PD Map, <u>public notices online</u> and circulations to CA planning committees.

Projection Screen

KCA was contacted by the St. Brigid's who rent the hall asked KCA whether we would be OK to install a projection screen in the hall. St. Brigid's is willing to donate \$500.00 towards the purchase of the projection screen.

Cris met with Robin and Robert on Tuesday, January 22, 2019 to discuss location of the screen, size, etc. If there are not issues with the board, then I will coordinate with Robert to the projection screen installed.

This item was parked for the next board meeting since the purpose, frequency and benefits of the screen for the upper hall level was not well understood. Will it enhance the rental aspect of the upper hall? The screen in the lower hall is getting used by the planning function when applicants present their drawings.

Ice Rinks

KCA received several queries regarding whether the ice was flooded. After consultation with Ken, he communicated that the ice was flooded and ready but due to the warm weather the condition of the ice was not optimal. The information was posted on Facebook.

MLA Report

January Report:

Dear Constituents:

Premier Notley and I are working hard to ensure our communities have the support they need and a government committed to fighting for what matters like Alberta jobs.

At events or on your doorstep, residents tell me they are concerned about the economy and want to know how we can get good value for our resources. I share these concerns with you and I assure you, we will not stop defending Alberta jobs.

Although successive federal conservative governments have failed to improve pipeline capacity, we will make sure Ottawa addresses this national crisis. We will keep holding their feet to the fire while moving forward with our short, medium and long-term plan.

After consulting with industry and our appointed envoys, we are mandating an across-the-board reduction of 365,000 barrels per day until new transport capacity comes online in an effort to immediately close the historic price gap for our resources and protect jobs. We are also working to clear the backlog of oil with the purchase of upwards of 7,000 railcars to transport 120,000 barrels of oil per day.

We must take steps to upgrade and refine our products here at home, which is why we are now seeking expressions of interest to build a new refinery so we can create more jobs and add more value to our resources.

Finally, we will not stop fighting to build new pipelines like the Trans Mountain expansion project – the first pipeline to tidewater in more than 60 years.

Albertans are advocating for this project and we will make sure their voices are being heard in Ottawa. As the owners of this resource, we are saying once and for all: Let's stop the talk and start acting. Let's start making more of the products the world needs, right here at home.

KCA received an email from Rachel regarding TD Park People Grants

"I'm excited to share that applications are now open for the TD Park People Grants program, which will provide \$2,000 grants to support 225 park events in Metro Vancouver, Calgary, Edmonton, Greater Toronto Area, Ottawa, Montreal, and Halifax Regional Municipality!

We know that community groups, like yours, need support to make events like park clean-ups, tree-planting and movie nights happen in city parks and green spaces.

Successful applicants will use the grant to host three events between April 20 and December 31 2019. The application is due March 4, 2019."

Partner Sharing Program

The Trico Centre Partnership Sharing Program Suspension effective April 1, 2019 - March 31, 2020.

The current Trico Centre Partner Sharing Program with our community association partners was implemented April 1st, 2017.

For every Trico Centre monthly continuous membership sold, Trico Centre sends a portion of the membership revenue to the partner community associations in which the members resides. This amount is \$1/month for every child, youth, student, 60+, and 60+ couple membership, and \$2/month for every adult, adult couple, and family membership.

On December 20, 2018, the Trico Centre Board of Directors approved the 2019 operating budget. Due to the challenges facing the 2019 operating budget, and as a proud non–profit, charitable, community operated facility, Trico Centre will not be able to give back and support our partner communities in 2019 through the Partnership Sharing Program. Therefore, the Trico Centre Board approved to suspend the Trico Centre Partnership Sharing program to the partner community associations effective April 1, 2019 - March 31, 2020. The portion of membership funds allocated to the partnered communities will remain with Trico Centre as membership revenue.

The portion of membership funds allocated to the non-partner communities will continue to go to the Trico Cares program.

Budget Approved

The 2019 Operating Budget was approved.

Fees

Effective April 1, 2019 - Trico fees will increase.


